Week in Recap

This week, only the US Senate was in session.

Senate Appropriation's Chair Patty Murray revealed that the committee plans to start markups on May 18th, as conversations with

Vice Chair Susan Collins on top-line spending levels continue. The date isn't set in stone and is contigent on a top-line spending agreement that would allow the subcommittee leaders to write their own bills.

The Senate Judiciary Committee approved the <u>EARN IT Act of 2023</u>, a proposal that would reform section 230 and open up liability to internet service providers if they fail to deal with child sexual abuse material on their services.

New Bill Introductions

• S.1464

- Sponsor: Sen. Gary Peters (D-MI)
- Summary: This bill aims to restrict the flow of illicit drugs into the United States.

• <u>S.1462</u>

- Sponsor: Sen. John Kennedy (R-LA)
- Summary: This bill would reform the Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act of 2004 by addressing provisions relating to the carrying of concealed weapons by law enforcement officers.

• <u>S.</u> 1445

- Sponsor: Sen. Markwayne Mullin (R-OK)
- Summary: This bill would provide for an affirmative defense for certain criminal violations.

• <u>S.1444</u>

- Sponsor: Sen. James Lankford (R-OK)
- Summary: This bill would increase the pay and enhance the training of US Border Patrol Agents.

• <u>S. 1443</u>

- Sponsor: Sen. James Lankford (R-OK)
- Summary: This bill would require an interagency strategy for creating a unified posture on counter-unmanned aircraft systems (C-UAS) capabilities and protections at international borders of the United States.

• <u>S.1422</u>

- o Sponsor: Sen. Brian Schatz (D-HI)
- Summary: This bill would authorize grants for emotional support services for incarcerated victims of sexual abuse.

• H.R. 3061

- Sponsor: Rep. Nick LaLota (R-NY-1)
- Summary: This bill would establish an Aviation Security Checkpoint Technology Fund in the Department of

Homeland Security to fund investments in aviation security checkpoint technology.

- H.R. 2- Secure the Border Act of 2023
 - Sponsor: Rep. Mario Diaz Balart (R-FL-26)
 - Summary: This is a comprehensive bill including over seven titles addressing border security, asylum reform, immigration parole reform, and legal workforce provisions.
- S. 1401
 - Sponsor: Sen. Jon Ossoff (D-GA)
 - Summary: This bill would establish an inspection regime for the Bureau of Prisons.
- S. 1387
 - Sponsor: Sen. John Cornyn (R-TX)
 - Summary: This bill would reauthorize the Project Safe Neighborhoods Grant Program.
