About this Webinar: The vast majority of dangerous, illicit drugs are being transported on our highways on a daily basis. This webinar is designed for Patrol and Narcotics officers, both experienced and newcomers alike. It focuses on the after-market hidden compartments in passenger vehicles. Specific techniques are covered to assist officers in detecting and accessing the hidden compartment. Videos and photographs from adjudicated cases are used in the presentation. Students will receive instruction in the identification, detection, and access of hidden compartments.

Presenter: Mike Conner is recently retired from the Maryland State Police. He served as a Sergeant and Commander of the Pro-Active Criminal Enforcement Team - the most successful interdiction team in Maryland's history. Mike has seized or contributed to the seizure of over \$14,000,000.00 in US currency and thousands of pounds of cocaine, marijuana, heroin, MDMA, prescription pills, and other illicit narcotics. Mike has located over 200 false compartments and has arrested hundreds of criminals during traffic stops for various crimes to include: theft, murder, terrorist activities, money laundering, drug trafficking, gun trafficking, cigarette smuggling, and even recovered two murder victims being transported along I-95. Mike has trained thousands of law enforcement officers across the United States. The techniques taught by Mike will greatly enhance the ability of the student in the detection and apprehension of criminals while conducting traffic stops.
