Special Agent Retired: Kevin Small has a BS in Criminal Justice from Northeast Missouri State University, a Law Degree from Washburn University School of Law, and became a Member of New Mexico Bar. Kevin retired from the Drug Enforcement Administration as a Special Agent. He has investigated in excess of 300 highway interdiction cases involving the concealment and transportation of illegal drugs and United States Currency. For a time, Kevin worked undercover purchasing narcotics. He started the Albuquerque Interdiction Group, which worked the Albuquerque International Airport, Amtrak Train Station, and Greyhound Bus Station with involvement in over 3500 seizures of drugs and United States Currency! Kevin's remarkable career also currently includes being an Instructor for the DEA's Two-Week State and Local School since 1991, and an Instructor for Operation JETWAY since 1994. Operation JETWAY is a week long school sponsored and funded by DEA and the El Paso Intelligence Center, which provides training for state, local, and federal enforcement officers in interdiction law and techniques. Kevin has been a Certified Instructor with DEA since 1996, an Instructor for INIA (aka SKYNARC) from 1998 to 2007, in addition to 2022 through 2024. INIA is an annual conference in the United States providing training to law enforcement officers worldwide who work drug interdiction. He's instructed for California, Utah, Kansas, Georgia, and Arizona Narcotics Officers' Associations, along with instructing for the Illinois State Police Interdiction Teams. Not only has Kevin instructed across the United States, he has also instructed in Bangkok, Thailand to Thailand Customs and Drug Suppression Agents at the new Bangkok Thailand Airport. His instructions includes Kingston, Jamaica to Drug Interdiction Teams assigned to Kingston, Jamaica Airport. He's been the instructor for Consensual Encounter Class-Certified through New Mexico Department of Public Safety since 1997, and Certified through Drug Enforcement Administration since 2001. The class that he developed, wrote, and instructs, teaches law enforcement officers how to conduct consensual encounters, on the highways and other public places, for seizures of narcotics and contraband.

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
