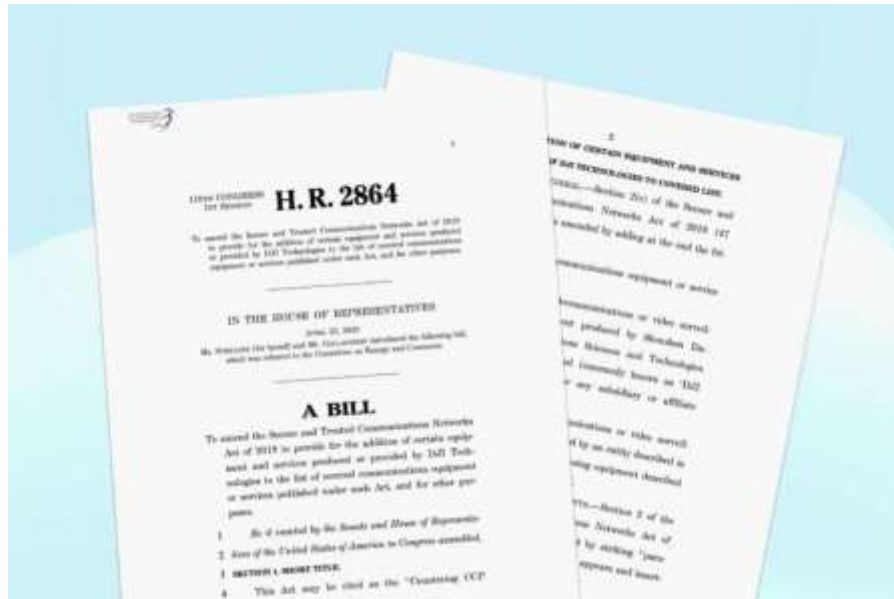

Bullet-Tracking Radar: Next Generation Technology vs. Acoustic Gunshot Detection

I spent three decades in American law enforcement and then continued to serve in the technology industry helping companies understand the use cases of policing. I observed many agencies adopting new solutions that promised to transform public safety, and some of them had great success. It was created to solve one of the most dangerous problems facing soldiers in battle: enemy sniper fire. That mission demanded absolute precision and situational awareness that displayed a shooter's location in real time. A lot of hard work and engineering resulted in a game-changing solution. WavePoint tracks the bullet, not the sound.

That same capability is now available to every law enforcement agency and security team responsible for protecting the public. This white paper explains what it is, why it represents a generational leap forward, and what it means for public safety.

Officers recognized for coordinated response during active shooter incident at public library

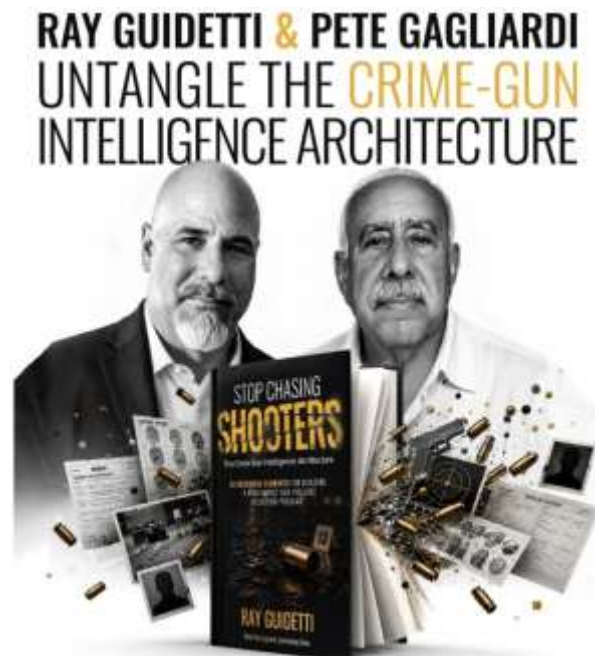

The Answer Was Fifteen Miles Away

Her name was Hazel Love. She was sixty-eight years old, murdered in her own home in McCalla, Alabama, in March 1996.

Detectives worked the scene. They recovered cartridge cases from the floor and bullets from her body at autopsy. The evidence was processed through NIBIN. The entry was made.

And then the case went cold.

Four years later, a felon was stopped fifteen miles away in Adamsville with a firearm. Officers logged the weapon and put it on a shelf.

Nobody queried NIBIN.

The gun sat for two years. It sat while Hazel Love's family waited. It sat while detectives worked other cases. It sat while the answer to a six-year-old murder gathered dust in a property room less than fifteen miles from where she died.

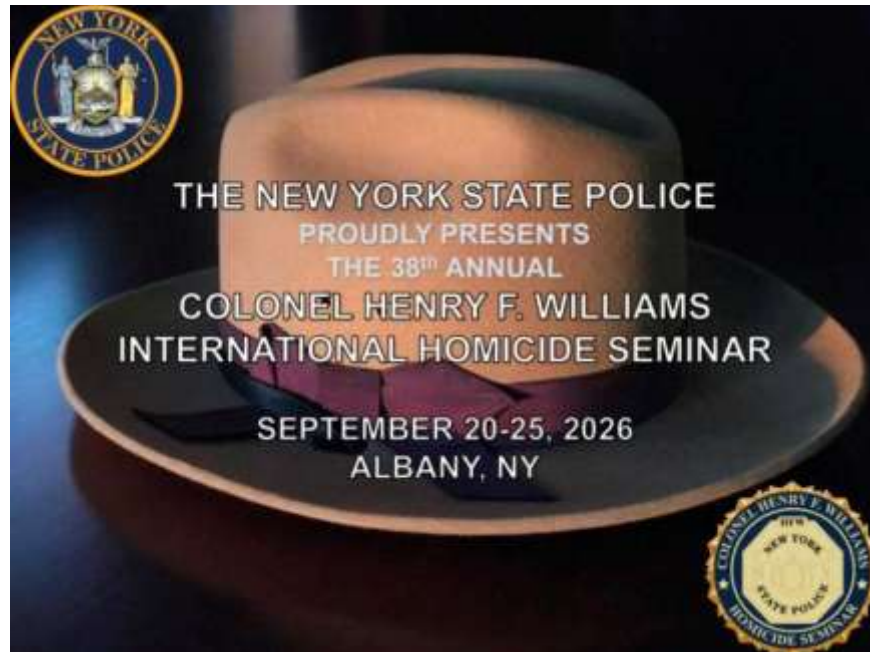
It sat because a gun in Adamsville had no way to find a NIBIN entry in Birmingham. Because a property room had no obligation to query the network. Because a sheriff's office had no mechanism to know the answer was sitting on a shelf in the next jurisdiction, waiting for someone to ask the right question of the right system.

Cyberattacks targeting municipal water systems have been reported in at least seven states this week, prompting the FBI and the Environmental Protection Agency to warn utilities nationwide that hackers are trying to disrupt critical water infrastructure.
